

COMMUNITY BASED DISASTER RISK REDUCTION (CBDRR)



With full support from Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA), USA, Yayasan Pusaka Indonesia had carried out a project entitled: “Supporting Local Governments and Communities in Demonstrating Processes and Stages to Developing the Culture of Safety and Resilience of Communities by integrating and implementing CBDRR into a Village Development Framework. It is implemented during 2010 until 2012.

The project was implemented in 8 villages,

namely 4 villages in Aceh Jaya (Kuala Unga, Karang Ateuh, Teumarem, Ujung Muloh), Lamno, the province of Aceh; and 4 villages in South Nias (Lagundri, Bawododara, Bawomataluwo, Hilisimaetano), the province of North Sumatra. The project had benefited and reached out 1,600 beneficiaries, either directly or indirectly in the said two project locations; 800 in Aceh Jaya/Lamno; and 800 in Teluk Dalam, Nias Selatan.

The main goal of the project was aimed at Building the Culture of Safety and Resilience of Communities and Village Governments in Nias Selatan and Aceh Jaya. With such a goal, this project had

sought to achieve 5 (five) tangible Specific Objectives, namely: 1). Ensuring Community-based Disaster Risk Reduction, done by multi sectors, be integrated into the implementation plan of village development policy framework; 2). Promoting initiative of community-based disaster risk reductions to be implemented in line with Village Development Plan, and is supported by village regulation and village development budget allocation; 3). Ensuring Village Regulations (Perdes) with regard to Emergency Response to be formulated and implemented at village levels; 4). Reinforcing Capacity Building promotion, among village government apparatuses, men, women, children, the elderly, the persons with disabilities, and other vulnerable groups; and 5). Integrating livelihood supports into local coping capacity development efforts.

Pusaka Indonesia continues to seek for support and contribution either from national or international communities that the Culture of Safety and Resilience becomes part of a peaceful life of all people presently living in disaster-prone areas, wherever they may be.
